
In accordance with Bar Standards Board requirements, Chambers publishes anonymised diversity data relating to its members, staff and pupils every three years. The publication of this data supports transparency and assists in monitoring equality and diversity across the profession.

In 2025, individuals were invited to provide diversity information for the purposes of publication. Completion of the questionnaire was voluntary and not all individuals responded. The data therefore represents a snapshot at a particular point in time and may not be fully representative of Chambers as a whole.






Survey Respondents by Gender




Age of Respondents












What is your ethnic group?
